4-H Enrollment Opened October 1

• BEFORE enrolling:

- Pick up the 4-H Clover from the Extension Office or view it at https://www.montana.edu/extension/pubs-linked-in-store/4-H_Clover_2024-2026_WEB.pdf to see projects available.
- Check the project age requirements for enrolling (below).
- Determine which level member should be in. If they completed a level in their project book last year, they need to move up to the next level. It is the family's responsibility to ensure member is placed in correct level at enrollment.
- Discuss as a family and/or with club leader how many projects are reasonable. For EACH project, member will complete approximately 7 activities in their project book AND a project journal for the year. For a beginning member, 1 to 2 projects may be reasonable, for an intermediate or advanced member, they are encouraged to take on additional projects and challenges. Members can drop or add any project up until May 1 with no penalty, but are responsible for project book costs.

Project Age Requirements

- Youth must meet the minimum required age by October 1, 2024 in order to enroll in each project.
- Cloverbuds 5 years old, Regular 4-H 8 years old
- Shooting Sports 9 years old
- Market Beef & Beef Breeding 10 years old
- Teen Leadership 13 years old Ambassador 14 years old
- Colt to Maturity 11 years old and have completed Horsemanship Levels 1, 2, and 3
- 4-H enrollment opens October 1. Members must be enrolled by January 1, 2025 for clubs to pay their member dues. Families are responsible for Cloverbud dues and any project costs (shooting sports fees, book fees, etc.) Following enrollment on ZSuite, families will receive an invoice and information on picking up project books, etc.
- Enrollment For New 4-H Families (families not enrolled in the last 2 years)
 - Using your computer, smart phone or other device go to 4h.zsuite.org.
 - o Click Sign Up. Complete all of the fields. Click LET'S GO.
 - Arrive at your HOUSEHOLD DASHBOARD and begin adding family members. Click on the name of the family member you want to enroll, click on the blue "start enrollment" button and follow the steps.
 - Complete the personal information, waivers, club and projects and hit SUBMIT. Extension
 Office will follow up with payment step/project books.

Shooting Sports

Archery practices will begin November 10 and practice times will be Friday 12 – 1:30 p.m. OR Sundays 1 – 2:30 p.m. Air Rifle/Air Pistol practices will begin in December and be Tuesday evenings from 4:30 - 6 p.m. with Chris Wilder.

Archery, Air Rifle, and Air Pistol are available to members to participate in for the Fall/Winter 24/25 4-H year. Youth must be 9 by October 1 for Archery, Air Rifle, or Air Pistol, or 8 for BB Gun Safety. All practices will be held in the basement of the Masonic Lodge, 221 West Main Street, Cut Bank, MT.

To participate, members need to be enrolled in Glacier County 4-H via ZSuite and have paid their fees. Shooting sports fees are \$15/discipline and a \$15 range fee for archery and air rifle (included on your invoice with project books, etc.) Shooting sports fees are capped at \$50/family. These funds pay for improvements, equipment, and costs associated with shooting. Families will also pay any book fees and member enrollment fees (unless member is in a club, then club pays member dues). After members enroll, they will receive an invoice for fees and books. Cash/check must be made to Glacier County 4-H.

After enrolling and paying fees, please login to ZSuite, go to Events, select Glacier County 4-H Shooting Sports registration and then through this, select a practice time, agree to the shooting sports waivers, select a t-shirt size (provided), note if you'll use club equipment or your own, etc.

Beef Weigh-Ins

Members will have two options for weighing in steers:

- Friday, December 1 Wade and Leslie Berkram's 9 a.m.
- Saturday, December 2 Hibbs Livestock 9 11 a.m.

Please let Kari know if you'll be weighing in at Berkram's as there's not cell service there and we don't want to miss anyone.

The minimum weight for 2025 Marias Fair is 1,100 pounds; max pay weight is 1,500 pounds, select steers accordingly. Each exhibitor may weigh in one spare animal/species. If doing a pen of three, four market animals may be weighed in. Any breeding animals must have the 4-H Clover tattoo OR Association registration tattoo OR Bangs vaccination tattoo by the official hog weigh-in deadline (which will be in April 2025). So, if you are doing a breeding project, your animal does not need to be weighed in at steer weigh-in but must have an appropriate tattoo by April.



All steers must be dehorned before weigh-in, as horned steers are NOT allowed at the fair. Also, ensure your steer has been fully castrated and is not a stag. All steers must have been born after January 1, 2024. 4-Her must be 10 as of Oct. 1 to show a market beef animal.

Information to bring to weigh-in:

- Steer's birth date
- Breed of steer (including percentages of each breed)
- Breeder's name and mailing address

Beef members, as you are purchasing steers, please be sure to get a Bill of Sale as this will be needed at the fair. Unless the steer is from the 4-Her's immediate family (father/mother), they need to have a Bill of Sale indicating a Change of Ownership. A Bill of Sale IS needed if purchasing from cousins, uncles, aunts, grandparents, neighbors, etc. They are also encouraged to have a Show Cattle Permit as well for transportation purposes. At the Marias Fair weigh-in in July, 4-Hers will be asked to sign a "ranch raised affidavit" if their steer is from their family.

If you have any questions on what is needed or need to get a Brand Inspection, please call Jeff Jergens, district brand inspector, at 406-450-0001, or local brand inspectors Chad Scarborough at 406-470-0712 or Tom Seifert at 406-873-5700. Please bring your Bill of Sale to December weighins so that we can make sure you have it. We will try to have some extra Bill of Sale forms available at our December weigh-ins if anyone needs as well.

Livestock Financing Limits have Increased

If you are looking for a way to finance your 4-H projects for this year, consider visiting with the Farm Service Agency. They recently increased the loan limit to \$10,000 and funds can be used for the purchase of animals, feed, supplies, etc. Youth between the ages of 10 and 20 are eligible. Loans are repaid annually and can be termed out for up to seven years for the purchase of breeding stock. The interest rate is currently 5.25%.  MT. Hannah will discuss preparing for calving season, stages of calving,
 intervention, and postnatal care.


