# 95. Government study workshop planned

Representatives from 112 areas in Montana will attend a workshop here December 15-16 to launch a two-year study of local governments. Lt. Governor Dennis Rehberg will be a featured speaker at the training session sponsored by the Local Government Center at Montana State University-Bozeman.

"The elected or appointed study commissioners attending this workshop represent the 33 counties and 79 municipalities that voted to undertake a Local Government Review," says Kenneth Weaver, director of the MSU Local Government Center.
