FINAL REPORT to the City of BAINVILLE

The Bainville Study Commission elected by the voters on Nov. 6, 1984, or thereafter appointed present this final report to the citizens of Bainville.

The purpose of the study commission, as defined in State law, is "to study the existing form and powers of our City government and procedures for delivery of local government services and compare them with other forms available under the laws of the State of Montana. If some changes are deemed necessary, the study commission may submit such proposed changes to the electors.

In conduct of their review the study commission has sought advice and information from a number of people in the community. Opinions and recommendations were solicited from community organizations and citizens. All meetings of the study commission were open to the public.

As a result of discussions held with the people and groups mentioned the Bainville City Study Commission has concluded that there is general consensus that the existing City Commission -Executive form of government has served well since its organization, and will continue to do so in the future. We therefore recommend no change in this form of government.
