DESIGN YOUR OWN & INDEPENDENT STUDY PROJECT PLANS DUE MARCH 1

Just a reminder that all members enrolled in any Design Your Own or Independent Study projects should complete a project plan and provide the Extension Office with a copy by March 1. 4-H BUILDING USE, CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS AND CLEANING SCHEDULE

The increased use of the 4-H Building results in more upkeep, use of supplies, etc. If you use the building, you are responsible for keeping it clean. If you find the building in unacceptable condition, call the Extension Office immediately.

Here are the requirements for using the building, even if only for an hour.

- Clean the floor (sweep & mop as needed); tables (wiped down); bathrooms (bowls & sinks clean); drinking fountain; garbage cans. Always empty garbage cans that contain food! Empty garbage cans if they are more than ½ full. Put garbage in large dumpster located outside the building.
- If kitchen dish cloths and/or towels are used, take them home to wash them and return to the 4-H Building or the Extension Office in a timely manner.
- After use, always shake out dust mops outside, clean broom brushes and rinse out mop.
- All chairs, materials and equipment must be returned to their original locations.
- Cleaning supplies are in the closet and the back room. If you notice that cleaning supplies are running low, please notify the Extension Office.

Once each year every 4-H club is responsible for doing a thorough cleaning of the entire 4-H building. One club is scheduled to clean every two weeks throughout the year except during the month of August. The 4-H Building Cleaning Instructions & Schedule are found on the Yellowstone County 4-H website under "Leader Resources" at https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/index.html. It is the club's responsibility to call the Extension Office to schedule a day and time during the two-week period. 4-H Building availability can be determined by looking at the 4-H Building calendar on the Yellowstone County 4-H website under "Calendars" at https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/4-HBuildingCalendar.html. We list the clubs that are scheduled to clean at the top of the month 4-H calendar lists the clubs including the date span you have to clean. We encourage you to schedule in advance by calling the Extension office.

BE CERTAIN TO READ! IT IS TIME FOR ENROLLMENT DROPS & ADDS

The deadline to add or drop projects to your 4-H enrollment is April 30, 2024. There will be no project changes allowed

after that time. No exceptions! Verifying the accuracy of projects and levels is important and can affect your FAIR entry eligibility. It is the responsibility of the members to make any desired changes. This is done by accessing your ZSuite account. Organizational leaders should notify the Extension Office at this time if a member has dropped out of your club.

YOUR ZSUITE HOUSEHOLD ADDRESS

When the Extension Office needs to send emails to members and/or leaders, we send them to your ZSuite household email address. We do not email every individual member and/or leader email address. The family household email address is the email of the "Primary" ZSuite account holder. If you find you need to change your family household email address, you may do so by accessing your household account in ZSuite.

YELLOWSTONE COUNTY FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Each year the Yellowstone County 4-H Foundation awards several scholarships to 4-H Alumni that plan on attending an institution of higher learning. You may only be awarded the Foundation Scholarship once. You may apply for the scholarship at any time after high school, even if you've been out of school for a year or more, you can apply. We will mail/email the scholarship application to those that will be graduating from High School in May. Application deadline is April 1, 2024. NILE SCHOLARSHIP

JUNIOR AG LOANS AVAILABLE THROUGH MT DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

"With the average age of farmers and ranchers being nearly 60 years old, supporting the next generation is vital to Montana's livelihood," said MDA Director Mike Foster. "The Junior Ag Loan Program plays a key role in connecting young people who are passionate about pursuing projects in agriculture with the financing they need to get started."

Montana youth ages 21 and under may be eligible for up to \$8,500 in loan financing through the Montana Department of Agriculture's (MDA) Junior Agriculture Loan Program.

The Montana Junior Agriculture Loan Program was developed to assist rural youth in developing or expanding agribusiness projects. The benefits often far exceed the actual loan value for program participants. Many young men and women have utilized the program as a means for establishing financing experience and advancing their project's monetary value.

Projects can involve crop and livestock production, custom farming, marketing and distribution, processing, and other financially feasible activities. Up to 90 percent of projects can be financed through the program with repayment terms of up to five years. STATE AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS DUE

May 1, 2024, is the due date for State Awards application. Members 14 and older as of October 1, 2023, are eligible. The Montana 4-H State Awards program is in place to recognize the outstanding accomplishments of 4-H members who have reached a standard of excellence in a variety of project and activity award areas. State Award winners have gone above and beyond regular project work with a focus on leadership, communication, and community service. 4-H members may self-nominate.

There can be more than one winner in a project, or activity area. A member can apply in any project or area; an application must be completed for each project or area in which they want to be considered. State award selection committees look for excellence in 4-H work, leadership, citizenship, and community service. All state and scholarship winners are announced at State 4-H Congress in July. If a member is selected as a state winner, they are eligible to attend National 4-H Congress in November.

The Annual Montana State 4-H Shooting & Archery Sports Competition will be held in Bozeman on March 1-3, 2024. This event is open to all enrolled 4-H members ages 9-19 in the Shooting Sports Projects. The registration is open and closes on February 23, 2024. Please see the 4-H State website at

https://www.montana.edu/extension/4h/programs/events/shooting_sports/shooting-sports-SS.html for all information regarding the State Shoot. The events held at the State Shoot are Air Rifle, Air Pistol, Smallbore Rifle, Smallbore Pistol, Target Archery, and 3D Archery.

The State Shoot will serve as the qualifier for the Air Rifle, Air Pistol, Smallbore Rifle, and Smallbore Pistol events. The top 4 individuals in each event will be invited to represent the State of Montana at the 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships to be held in Grand Island, Nebraska, June 23-28, 2024. Those individuals trying out for the Sporter Air Rifle Team must compete in Sporter 3P and Sporter Standing. The top 4 finishers will be determined from the combined scores from these two events.

To attend the 4-H Shooting Sports National Championships, participants must have passed their 14th birthday by January 1, 2024, and may not have passed their 19th birthday before January 1 of the current year in which the championships are held.

2023-2024 ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE POLICY & WORKSHOP SCHEDULE * NEW GUIDELINES

All 4–H and FFA members exhibiting any animal in Department A (Junior Livestock) at MontanaFair are required to attend an MSU Extension ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING (AQA) (per state guidelines) provided by the 4-H Committee or an FFA Advisor/Agriculture Educator prior to the first MontanaFair entry deadline or exhibitors do not show. Yellowstone County has two 4-H age brackets for AQA training. Exhibitors must attend AQA as Beginners/Juniors (4-H age 8-13), and as a senior member (4-H age 14-19). This age is based on the exhibitors "4-H Age" – the age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors must take Animal Quality Assurance the first year they reach each age bracket or the first year they are exhibiting in an animal project. All classes will include the same teaching materials and use the same forms and paperwork. Class content is determined by a committee and updated every two years. A parent or legal guardian must also attend the AQA Training.

There will be hands on, group activities. Please plan on arriving on time with a parent with both staying for the complete 1½ hours. If you and your parent are not in attendance for the <u>complete</u> training, you may be asked to attend another session. Plan on attending a session early in the year so conflicts do not occur in your family schedule. **More workshops will NOT be added after the June 19 class. It is the final opportunity for 2024.**

The sessions in January and May are face-to-face at this time at PAYS. For the virtual sessions, people will log into the Webex meeting (Webex link information will be sent out via email prior to each session) to learn the information then go to the online program, pay their own \$12 fee, and take the online class. A copy of the completion certificate must be provided to the Extension Office.

MSU EXTENSION 4-H HORSE HELMET POLICY & WORKSHOP SCHEDULE

Participants in the 4-H Horse Project are required to attend a Horse Helmet Workshop once as a beginner/junior 4-H member (8-13) and again as a senior 4-H member (14 and up). This age is based on the exhibitors "4-H Age" — the age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors must attend a Horse Helmet Workshop the first year they reach every age bracket or the first year they are exhibiting in an animal project. A parent or legal guardian must also attend the Horse Helmet Workshop.

After attending a 4-H Helmet Workshop, riders may choose whether they will wear a certified helmet. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the 4-H member to see that the headgear worn complies with such standards and is in good condition. The Montana 4-H Center for Youth Development encourages the use of ASTM certified/SEI approved safety helmets in all equine events. Protective headgear may be used in all classes and shall not be discriminated against. Helmet use is encouraged in all 4-H horse activities any time a 4-H member is around a horse. A certified equestrian helmet with safety harness fastened in place is required in over fence classes and gymkhana events, activities, and practice sessions. Gymkhana refers to horseback speed events (timed or un-timed) that do not use livestock. Events that usually fall in this category include, but are not limited to: barrel racing, pole bending, keyhole

races, stake races, rescue races, pony express race, etc. Events that are not intended to be included in this policy are events such as calf roping, team roping, goat tying, and team penning that may be timed but use livestock. **More workshops will NOT be added after the May 4 class. It is the final opportunity for 2024.**
